MISSION HIGHLIGHT: I.D.E.S.



IDES stands for International Disaster Emergency Service. IDES exists to bring glory to God by meeting physical and spiritual needs in our hurting world until Jesus returns. For the past 46 years IDES has served as a channel through which Christian Churches/Churches of Christ and individual Christians could meet the physical and spiritual needs of suffering people throughout the world. The vision statement: "IDES vision is to lead the independent Christian Churches/Churches of Christ in responding to disasters and emergencies in the United States and throughout the world by mobilizing financial and physical resources to and through their missionaries and congregations for the purpose of benevolent evangelism."

IDES has been the one source our churches and missionaries consistently turn to for help. In 2018, IDES celebrated 45 years of meeting physical and spiritual needs of suffering people throughout the world in the name of Jesus Christ. They have distributed millions of dollars over the years to help with disaster relief, development projects, medical needs, evangelism and hunger. Among independent Christian Churches/Churches of Christ, the work of IDES is unique. "Many areas in eastern Africa are experiencing a drought emergency. Malnutrition and disease are on the rise. A friend of IDES was visiting a mission in Kenya where he was providing pastoral training and counseling to a group of pastors. "Cows were thin as a stick and were eating paper" he said. A few days into his visit, a truck arrived at the mission and food began to be unloaded from the back. When the mission started distributing the food to those in need, he found out it was from IDES. "Without this food that is provided each month, my family would not be alive today," a lady from the community told him with tear in her eyes." (newsletter May 17, 2019)

On Sept. 28 Countryside is having a charity cruise in at the church. The money raised through donations for food and a car auction will all be donated to IDES for their global work. You can sign up now to assist with the event and be part of this fund raiser for this mission and their work both here and abroad.

As you can see IDES is a very busy, global organization meeting a variety of physical and spiritual needs. For more information about their activities check the mission booklet on the mission table in the foyer.

Ann's Helping Hands






It's Not Supposed to Be This Way



What you need:


- · Cups (various sizes)
