From the Church Office...

Recently in our adult Sunday School class as we worked our way through the book of 1 Corinthians and the struggles of the early church, a member of our congregation offered this illustration which I thought was especially profound and poignant.

As he looked outside the window at the trees, he said that a tree doesn't grow strong without the wind. It needs the push and pull of the wind in order to form deep roots. If there never was any struggle, it would topple over when it grew taller. Likewise, as Christians we gain our strength through the struggles He brings us through.

I did a little research when I got home because the illustration stayed with me. "There was a great experiment done in the early 1980s in the desert called the biodome. It was an exercise to create the perfect living environment for human beings, plant, and animal life. A huge glass dome was constructed and an artificial, controlled environment was created with purified air and water, filtered light, and so on, offering the perfect growing conditions for trees, fruits and vegetables... and humans. People lived in the biodome for many months at a time, and it was wonderful because everything seemed to do well, with one exception. When the trees that were planted grew to be a certain height, they would simply topple over. It baffled scientists for the longest time, until one day they realized the one natural element they forgot to recreate in the biodome: wind! Trees need wind to blow against them, which in turn causes their root systems to grow deeper into the soil, which in turn supports the tree as it grows taller.

We can learn a great deal from the nature of a tree if we are open to the lesson. Watch how a tree bends and sways gracefully when the

wind blows against it. It does not stand rigid, resisting the flow of energy. It does not push back. The tree accepts the strong wind as a blessing that helps it grow. Like a tree, we too need the contrast of the winds of life pushing against us. In those times, we need to remember that infinite intelligence is the soil, the essential foundation upon which we grow our lives. Then we can view the challenges in our lives as blessings. It is that contrast that develops our character and deepens our spiritual roots in the rich soil of being.



MISSION HIGHLIGHT: Lincoln Christian University

Countryside Christian Church offers scholarships to students attending full time at LCU or other Christian Universities. Currently LCU is providing interim ministers to us during our time of our preacher search. We are so grateful for this assistance.

"Lincoln Bible Institute, 'LBI' was born in the mind and heart of Earl C. Hargrove in 1944 as the result of a God-given vision. From the very beginning unto this very day, countless people have sacrificially provided the resources to carry out this Godgiven vision of supplying dedicated and well-trained workers for the Kingdom." Lincoln Christian University (initially Lincoln Bible Institute, then Lincoln Christian College and Seminary, now Lincoln Christian University) was launched on May 4, 1944, to help prepare people to carry out God's effort through the church.



For decades, LCU has trained servant leaders to serve the church and world. Mr. Hargrove, LCU's founding president, stated: "We need Kingdom workers." In addition to supplying churches with preachers, LCU has trained worship ministers, youth ministers, church secretaries, Christian education directors, small group leaders, elders, Sunday school teachers, mission committee members and a host of other roles in the church. We are thrilled that God has used so many who took classes at LCU to help build His Church.



For nearly 75 years, LCU has been educating Kingdom-minded leaders to serve in the church and the world. More than 16,000 have studied there. Hundreds of men and women are currently studying at Lincoln Christian University, learning how best to communicate the Word of God to this generation and the next.



4 Simple Ways to Get Deeper Relationships out of Small Groups

- 1. Make small group a priority. You can't develop meaningful relationships unless you do it consistently.
- 2. Respect the ideas of others. If small groups are going to teach people how to love—and help the church grow warmer—we need to listen and value one another's opinions. In today's culture, social media has conditioned us to push back hard on whatever we disagree with. But that's why I love how Eugene Peterson paraphrases Romans 14:1: "Welcome with open arms fellow believers who don't see things the way you do. And don't jump all over them every time they do or say something you don't agree with—even

when it seems that they are strong on opinions but weak in the faith department. Remember, they have their own history to deal with. Treat them gently" (The Message). That's a great model for the relationships within our small groups.

3. Strive for vulnerability and transparency. This will really take a small group to the next level. When people can talk openly about their faults, stresses, pressures and troubles of life, small groups will grow. Most people don't get that opportunity anywhere else. They can't be open and share their problems at

work. They can't do it at school. Frankly, they often can't do it at home. People spend lots of time pretending their lives are perfect. But for us to grow, we should be able to be open and honest about their pain.

4. Encourage one another with accountability. The Bible tells us in Hebrews 10:24 how important this is: "Let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds" (NIV). Every person needs to have someone who can spur them on to reach their goals whether those goals are spiritual, health, career, family, etc. Accountable relationships are rare, but we need them.

• How do leaves get from place to place? With autumn-mobiles.



rvest hunt




- · 1/3 cup roasted pumpkin
- seeds
- 1/3 cup almonds
- 1/4 cup raisins 2/3 cup dried fruit (any)

What you do:

- 1. Microwave syrup, spices, seeds and nuts for 30 seconds at a time, stirring frequently, until mixture thickens.
- 2. Spread the mixture on a baking sheet lined with wax paper. Let cool and harden.
- 3. Break the candied nuts into chunks. Combine with dried fruit.
- 4. Store in airtight container.


Directions: After unscrambling each leaf's word, follow the vine to complete the Bible verse.
