# MISSION HIGHLIGHT: Christ to China

*In September, 2018 the Mission department decided to add, Christ to China, (C2C) to the missions supported by Countryside. In April Wing Wong came to the Faith/Promise rally and presented his mission work C2C, in New Hampshire and also in China. Wing Wong has worked for many years in China presenting the message of Christ to the people and also to the Chinese in New Hampshire. The work in New Hampshire is under the partnership of Restoration House Ministries.*

“Just a few hours ago, the Hong Kong police bombarded the Chinese University of Hong Kong with over a thousand tear gas canisters, and numerous rubber bullets after an unarmed young man was shot in the stomach by a traffic cop with a live bullet at close range yesterday. Over 60 students and teachers needed emergency medical treatment in the university. Even the president of the university and legislators could not stop the police from entering the campus.



Since the CEO of Hong Kong met with President Xi in Shanghai and Vice-Premier Han Zheng in Beijing last week, the police have intensified their forces to crack down the protests. The police's irrational, uncontrollable, and excessive use of force provoked even the most peaceful protesters and citizens. Many said yesterday (Nov.11) was the worse day of Hong Kong.

Sadly, we probably haven't seen the worst yet. On the 11<sup>th</sup> of November the Hong Kong people had their first taste of evil from Communist China!



Please pray that justice, humanity and love will be restored in Hong Kong. Without that, there will be no peace. Pray also that the Hong Kong government will not become the extension of the iron wrist of the communist party in China. Pray that the Lord will bring hope back to the young people in Hong Kong and they will find a better way to encounter the police brutality and unfairness than violence.” (Newsletter Nov. 12, 2019)

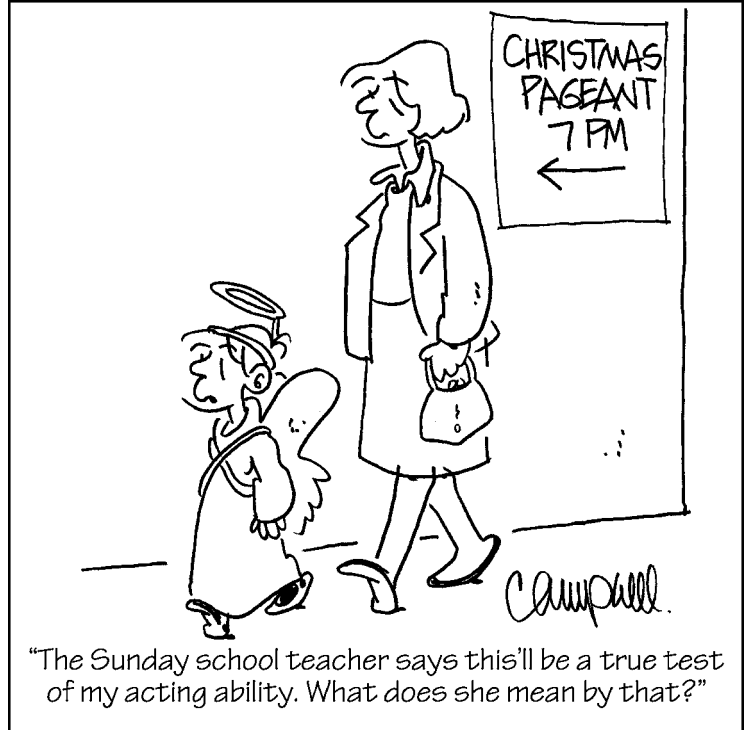
Our Sunday School Children's Program is called:

# OUR GIVING THIS MONTH

A careful reading of 2 Corinthians 9 is quite eye-opening. One of the things we see is a cycle of giving that includes the gracious giving of God, the generous giving of those who have received from God, and the giving of thanks from those who have received from God through others. The abundant giving of God is prominent (v. 8). His giving is evident in nature and other areas (v. 10). He enriches us so we can be generous (v. 11), and His gifts include grace that cannot be measured (v. 14). His ultimate gift (the gift of His Son) is “indefinable”—words are inadequate to communicate its worth (v. 15).

On the way home from church, my daughter sat in the backseat enjoying Goldfish crackers as my other children implored her to share. Trying to redirect the conversation, I asked the hoarder of snacks, “What did you do in class today?” She said they made a basket of bread and fish because a child gave Jesus five loaves and two fish that Jesus used to feed more than 5,000 people (John 6:1–13).

“That was very kind of the little boy to share. Do you think maybe God is asking you to share your fish?” I asked. “No, Momma,” she replied.

I tried to encourage her not to keep all the crackers to herself. She was unconvinced. “There is not enough for everyone!”

Sharing is hard. It is easier to hold onto what we see in front of us. Perhaps we do the calculation and reason there is simply not enough for everyone. And the assumption is that if I give, I will be left wanting.

Paul reminds us that all we have comes from God, who wants to enrich us “in every way so that [we] can be generous” (2 Corinthians 9:10–11). The math of heaven isn’t a calculation of scarcity but of abundance. We can share joyfully because God promises to care for us even as we are generous to others.

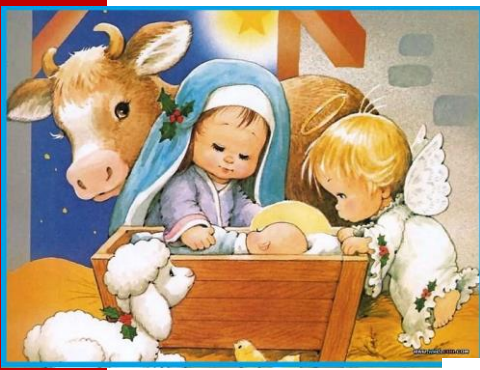

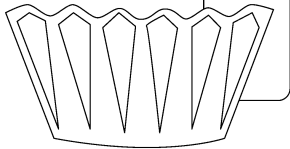

Make some Christmas candles to remember Jesus, the Light of the world.

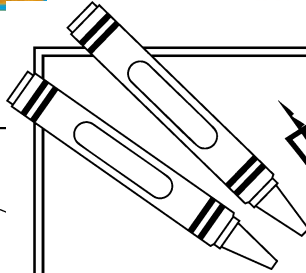


**What you need:**

- Unlined white notecards
- Hot glue (and adult help)
- Yellow tissue paper
- Mini muffin liners
- Clothespins

**What you do:**

1. Roll a notecard from side to side into a "candle" tube. Secure with glue.
2. Insert a piece of tissue paper "flame" in one end.
3. Glue the other end to a muffin liner. Then glue the liner to a clothespin.
4. Repeat to make many paper candles. Pin them to the branches of a Christmas tree.

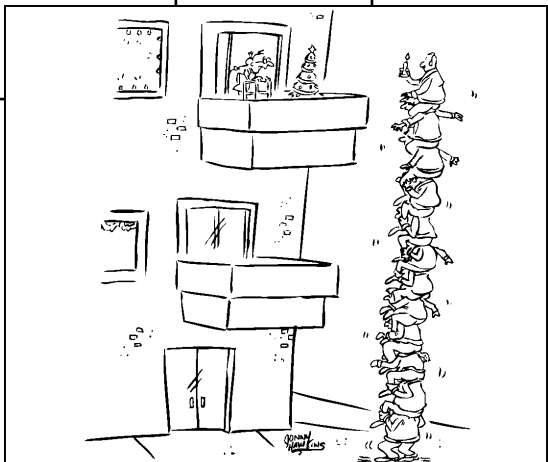
