S.A.W. Program

If you are ages 13-18, you might be interested in becoming a SAW (Servant At Work). After completing an application by May 1, you would then volunteer to work a week or weekend at camp. You would then be eligible for a camp registration discount.

There are also **work days** scheduled that may interest you.

There are **early registration incentives**. If you register by May 1, there is a \$10 discount for Teddy Bear and First Chance camps and a \$20 discount for all other camps. There are other camper discount vouchers available as well. This information is all explained in the camp brochure.

Countryside will also pay for half of your child's registration up to \$100 by using a camp voucher to be sent along with your registration. If your finances are tight, Countryside will make it possible for your kids to attend camp! Please see Cathy Lotz about getting a camp voucher or if you have any questions.

Time goes quickly so start making your plans now for an awesome camp experience for you, your child, or your whole family!



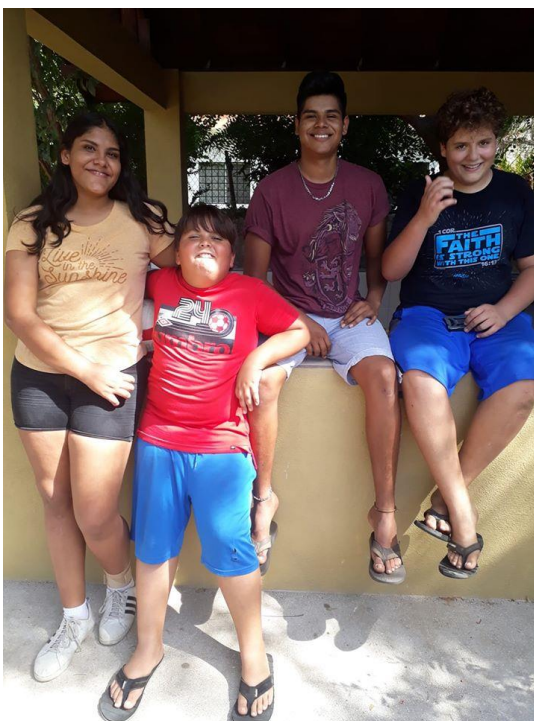
MISSION HIGHLIGHT: Me and My House

Josh and Susan Sanchez are missionaries who established the church in Manzanillo, Mexico and are now working with the church in Colima, Mexico. They have worked in Mexico since January of 2006. Josh grew up in Mexico City, Mexico and attended Central Christian College in Moberly, MO 1999-2003. Susan grew up in Mexico, MO in the Christian Church. She attended CCCB in 1999-2003 also.

The year 2019 was eventful for the Sanchez family. At the end of the school year, they moved to Colima where they are ministering to the church family there. In late summer, Susan's personal information was stolen and used to open a bank account. Their forwarding agents caught this before any deposits or withdrawals were made. This fraudulent activity is being monitored and proper reports have been filed. In October, Susan had a health scare ending up in the ER with a UTI. After treatment she ended up with a secondary infection in her abdomen requiring more antibiotic treatment. All of the incidents created stress both physically and on their financial situation. Currently, Susan is completely recovered.



In December, Scarlett, a teenager who had been living with them since July, went to visit her father and possibly live with him in Cozumel. This did not work out so Scarlett and Rafa, her brother, moved in with the Sanchezes after Christmas. "We ask for your prayers, for their hearts, for our family. For the provision as feeding two teenagers is a whole new level of expenses. We pray for their growth in Christ. If they only understood how much He loves them and cares for them." (Dec. Newsletter)



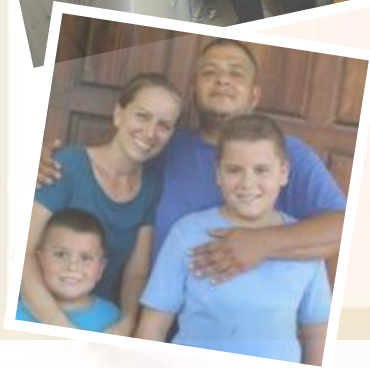

To those who may not have noticed the Missions Department’s “Goal Pole” at the front of the sanctuary, we would like to give you an update. As you might remember, last April we, as a congregation, promised \$39,770 to go toward the expenses of the seven missions we support. With a few weeks to go until our ending date of April 26 (Faith Promise Sunday), we have already given about 90% of that money. It seems that the finish line is very close and we will surpass that total of nearly \$40,000! Let’s continue our faithfulness to God and surpass that number with joy and celebration! That Sunday will also be the beginning of the next “Missions Year.” We will be collecting our faith promises for the coming year during the worship service that Sunday.

As you remember, April 26th is not just the end of the current Faith Promise year, but it is also our “Mission, Not Impossible” Sunday. We will be sharing an update from each of our missionaries during the worship service that Sunday. Please mark your calendar for this very important day in the life of Countryside and our missionaries. We will look forward to the beginning of the next “Missions Year” with an even larger goal as we bring our Faith Promises forward during the worship service. Remember our missionaries can only continue the important work of sharing the good news of Jesus with the prayerful and monetary support of churches like Countryside!

OUR GIVING THIS MONTH

Jesus honored a sinful woman who washed His feet with her tears, wiped them dry with her hair, and then poured out an expensive flask of perfume on His feet (Luke 7:36–50). Assuring the woman that her sins were forgiven, Jesus tells disgusted religious leaders that she is an example of one who having been forgiven much loves all the more (v. 47). It is in this context that we read that some women who had been cured of evil spirits and various diseases traveled with Jesus to support Him and His disciples out of their own means. Maybe we can ask ourselves: What grace and mercy have we received that gives us reason to give attention, respect, comfort, and encouragement to others?

Note: This is a faith promise, a covenant between myself and God. It is my voluntary offering for the evangelization of the world.

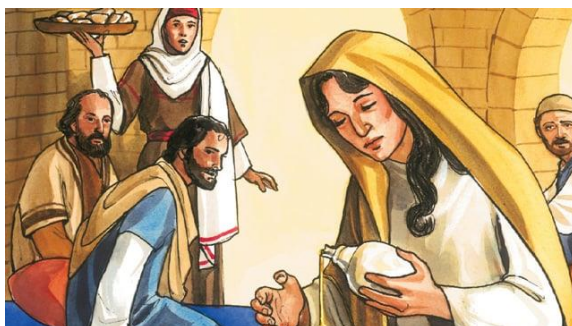
The little boy was only eight when he announced to his parents’ friend Wally, “I love Jesus and want to serve God overseas someday.” During the next ten years or so, Wally prayed for him as he watched him grow up. When this young man later applied with a mission agency to go to Mali, Wally told him, “It’s about time! When I heard what you wanted to do, I invested some money and have been saving it for you, waiting for this exciting news.” Wally has a heart for others and for getting God’s good news to people.

Jesus and His disciples needed financial support as they traveled from one town and village to another, telling the good news of His kingdom (Luke 8:1–3). A group of women who had been cured of evil spirits and diseases helped to support them “out of their own means” (v. 3). One was Mary Magdalene, who had been freed from the presence of seven demons. Another was Joanna, the wife of an official in Herod’s

court. Nothing is known about Susanna and “many others” (v. 3), but we know that Jesus had met their spiritual needs. Now they were helping Him and His disciples through giving their financial resources.

When we consider what Jesus has done for us, His heart for others becomes our own. Let’s ask God how He wants to use us.

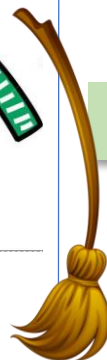

Joyful noise



Use your voice and this hand-crafted percussion instrument to make joyful noises to the Lord.

What you need:

- Dry beans (about one Tbsp)
- Plastic Easter egg
- 2 plastic spoons
- Masking tape
- Markers and stickers

What you do:

1. Place the beans inside the egg and snap it closed.
2. Set the egg in a spoon and cover it with the second spoon so the spoons are holding the egg.
3. Tape the spoons to the egg. Also wrap tape around the spoons from top to bottom to make a shaker handle.
4. Decorate your shaker and use it as you sing praises to God.
5. Experiment with sounds by filling other eggs with coins, rice, and so on.
