Pioneer Bible Translators exists to disciple the Bibleless, mobilizing God's people to provide enduring access to God's Word. Our vision is to see transformed lives through God's Word in every language.

The work is not finished until there are networks of churches using Scripture to grow, mature and multiply in every language group on Earth.



Norm and Jill Weatherhead work with Pioneer Bible Translators in Papau New Guinea as Bible translators. They have been involved there for over 20+ years. They are from Calgary, Canada. Jill works a portion of the year as a registered nurse in Calgary and joins Norm when she can to work with the translation team in PNG. Norm is the Director of Language Affairs for his branch of Papua New Guinea in Bible translation and literacy.

Drawn by a vision to see God's Work changing lives in every language, Norm and his wife, Jill have devoted their lives to translation work.

In 2017 at the Faith/Promise event Norm presented the Countryside congregation a copy of the New Testament in

Mborema Kam, one of the many languages of Papua New Guinea. The translation and printing of the New Testament represented 32 years of translation work. Norm and Jill have spent 20+ years of their work with this book and Countryside has been a financial supporter during those 20 years. It was a true pleasure to receive this gift and to learn the part that we at Countryside played in bringing the Bible to people who previously did not have access to the written word of God.

Currently Norm and the translation team are working on the book of 1Timothy. Norm has been able

to evaluate the Akukem text and has prepared over 150 questions to ask the team about to make sure the meaning of the text matches the Greek New Testament. The other major work being done with the Akukem is to prepare all the materials which will be used in a Literacy Fluency Workshop to be held out in an Akukem village this July. This includes a Transfer Primer, a shellbook story books, a song book and a scripture portion booklet of Luke material. As you can see, this has been a very busy month and it has required Norm to be able to understand and communicate in English, Tok Pisin, Mborena Kam, Hebrew, Akukem and Greek. Praise God for the training and experience which Norm has to be able to communicate in all these languages. (Feb 21, 2020 Newsletter)

To those who may not have noticed the Missions Department's "Goal Pole" at the front of the sanctuary, we would like to give you an update. As you might remember, last April we, as a congregation, promised \$39,770 to go toward the expenses of the seven missions we support. With a few weeks to go until our ending date of April 26 (Faith Promise Sunday), we have already given about 90% of that money. It seems that the finish line is very close and we will surpass that total of nearly \$40,000! Let's continue our faithfulness to God and surpass that number with joy and celebration! That Sunday will also be the beginning of the next "Missions Year." We will be collecting our faith promises for the coming year during the worship service that Sunday.

As you remember, April 26th is not just the end of the current Faith Promise year, but it is also our "Mission, Not Impossible" Sunday. We will be sharing an update from each of our missionaries during the worship service that Sunday. Please mark your calendar for this very important day in the life of Countryside and our missionaries. We will look forward to the beginning of the next "Missions Year" with an even larger goal as we bring our Faith Promises forward during the worship service. Remember our missionaries can only continue the important work of sharing the good news of Jesus with the prayerful and monetary support of churches like Countryside!

God's Plan for the Resurrection

John 16:16-20



"A little while, and you will no longer see Me." Jesus repeated these words to His disciples several times. But He could tell by the blank stares on their faces that they did not understand what He had said.

At one point, He even overheard them debating what He meant by "You will not see me" (John

16:19). These men had been with the Lord for three years. They had laughed with Him, cried with Him, eaten with Him, and were willing to die with Him, or so they thought.

They had just entered the city of Jerusalem. And instead of being met by an angry legion of guards and protestors, they were met by palm-waving supporters shouting: "Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord." Yet as soon as they had settled into the upper room, Jesus broached the subject of His forthcoming death. Immediately, the mood of His followers went from one of celebration to shock and sorrow.

Often in difficult times, we cannot see beyond that moment. The resurrection was a few days away, but they could not fathom its wondrous coming.

God always provides the encouragement we need to stay the course, and Jesus did this for His disciples when He told them, "Your sorrow will be turned to joy" (v. 20). This also is God's message of hope and love for us today. Blessed be the name of the Lord!

Facetime or Skype grandparents or grandchildren on tablets,







- 1. Cut the carnation stems (at an angle) to about 8 inches long.
- Fill the vase halfway with water. Add 10 drops of food coloring. (More may be needed to darken the water.)
- 3. Add the cut flowers and observe what happens to the petals over time.
- 4. Discuss how this is like Jesus' work on the cross. Read 1 Peter 2:22-24 (NIV) and reflect on what his death means for us.
- 5. To learn more about this experiment, research capillary action.
