Our staff consists of Kathy Kohrt, Connie Curry, Sandy Lawrence, Sarah Denekas, Laura Schmidt, Ellie and Nathan Johnson, Becki Winger, Wayne and Cathy Lotz, and me. They have a wonderful spirit of "Yes we can!" and the program has truly been refreshing.

We hope to expand our ability to serve through Kids Club in October by raising the enrollment to 20 kids. This will happen when we have a few more volunteers join our staff. If you are available, we would love to see this program grow with your help. Are you available from 8am – 11am on Wednesdays in October? Are you available just one Wednesday or only an hour each Wednesday? Please contact the church office if you are available to help us reach our goal.

One more thing. We are planning to have a time of fellowship with the Kids Club families. We want to have a couple of fire pits burning and some S'more- making going on here on the church campus Saturday evening

October 3rd. Will you please join us in prayer as we want these families to feel good about our church, the community it can provide, and ultimately we want them to meet Jesus.

MISSION HIGHLIGHT: Local Food Pantry



Located at Messiah Lutheran Church in Port Byron

Countryside supports this pantry with monthly donations. **Things which are needed by the pantry include** (these lists are not inclusive.):

- non-perishable food items as well as cleaning items (dish soap, laundry soap, bar soap)
- paper products (paper towels, toilet tissue, facial tissue)
- personal hygiene products (toothbrushes, toothpaste, deodorant, feminine hygiene products)
- and baby items including diapers and baby food.

The food pantry is for residents of the Riverdale School District and is open 12(noon)-2:00 pm each Wednesday. Due to the Corona Virus, items will be pre-packed and delivered to your vehicle in a drive-through at the church parking lot. The food pantry can be reached at 309-523-2421 if there are questions.

Countryside items are delivered to the pantry the last week of each month. Food pantry items remain in great need all year round. With the current pandemic the needs within our community are even greater. The pantry also accepts cash donations and then purchases items that are needed. 
Another year has flown by already and it's that time for our Annual Meeting.

Create autumn-themed artwork



- · Seed pods, nuts, pine cones
- Mixing bowl
- · 2 cups flour • 1 cup salt
- 1 cup warm water
- Adult help

What you do:

- Go on a nature walk and collect seeds with interesting textures.
- 2. In the bowl, mix flour and salt. Gradually add water. On a table, knead the dough. (If too dry, add more water; if too sticky, add more flour.)
- 3. Flatten a ball of dough and stamp impressions in it with the seeds.
- If desired, bake for several hours at 150 degrees until dry and hard. Or, to reuse dough, store in an airtight container up to 6 months.
