## MISSION HIGHLIGHT: Rock River Christian Camp

ock River Christian Camp is located near Polo, Illinois. It is our Christian camp outreach and is supported by about 30 Christian churches in the WI, IL, and IA area.

Because of the Covid virus this camping summer has been very different. This summer has been very quiet with all summer programs canceled. The staff has been working very hard at keeping expenses down, the pool remains closed, no large food orders, keeping electrical to a minimum and no summer staff salaries. They are maintaining the grounds and working on small projects that do not cost much if anything. Phase 4 for the State of Illinois states, "no overnight camps allowed" so no retreats. Phase 4 will last until a vaccine is available so no camps in the foreseeable future. As a camp staff and camp board they will continue to talk through options as well as what they plan to do in the future if nothing changes.

This is a hard year for RRCC as it impacts the financial state of the camp significantly. When the camp board met in November the projects that are currently on hold are for a roof for the earth lodge and repairs to the septic system. These will need to be addressed before the camping season. If RRCC has impacted your life and you would like to see it continue to impact lives for future generations, then do your part today and give.

The National Camping Association, which the camp is a member of, has chosen "**Resilient**" as its motto for this year. Many ideas and challenges are being discussed with this organization to learn how other camps are dealing with the virus.

Another way you can help is by coming to camp for a day to **volunteer your time**. Things to be done include weeds to pull, wood to split, some plumbing to be done, and many other projects for all skills and age levels. If you would like to come help for a day, let them know and you can be scheduled for a day to come work. The annual report including financials are in the RRCC booklet on the mission shelf.

**Please pray for the camp**, that the will of God will continue to be their guide as decisions are made. We know this is a special place for people of all ages to come and focus on God! We know that lifelong friendships are made here! We know that lives are changed here and have been for 66 years on this property. Please know we will be praying for all of you.

On January 13, 1984, President Ronald Reagan issued a proclamation designating January 22 as the first National Sanctity of Human Life Day. (January 22, 1973, was the day the U.S. Supreme Court legalized abortion-on-demand in all 50 states.)

Churches around the United States use the day to celebrate God's gift of life, commemorate the many lives lost to abortion, and commit themselves to protecting human life at every stage.

# OUR GIVING THIS MONTH

#### YTD Offering Budget: \$24,230 YTD Offering Actual: \$22,662 YTD Faith Promises: \$22,506

*"The purpose of tithing is to teach you always to put God first in your lives"* (Deuteronomy 14:23). Whatever you want God to bless, you have to put him first in. So if you want God to bless your finances, you have to put him first in your money. This is the principle of tithing: You give the first 10 percent of your income back to God.

Here are four verses that explain the **promise, the purpose, the place, and the day for tithing**. First, Prov 3:9-10 gives the promise about tithing: *"Honor the Lord by giving him the first part of all your income, and he will fill your barns with wheat and barley and overflow your wine vats with the finest wines"*. God says that if you honor him with the first part of your income, he will bless you financially.

Kay and I decided over 40 years ago that if we're going to be in debt to anybody, we're not going to be in debt to God. God gets paid first, right off the top. If I make 10 bucks, the first dollar goes back to him. If I make a hundred bucks, the first 10 bucks go back to him. It all comes from God in the first place, and I want his blessing on the rest of it.

**Why** does God tell us to tithe? Deuteronomy 14:23 says, *"The purpose of tithing is to teach you always to put God first in your lives"* (TLB). God doesn't need your money, but he wants what it represents: your heart. He wants you to trust him.

**Where** should you tithe? Do you tithe to United Way? Or do you tithe to your brother who's been out of work for three years? No. That's charity. Tithing is an act of worship. It goes to God. Malachi 3:10 says, *"Bring to the storehouse a full tenth of what you earn . . . Test me in this,' says the Lord All-Powerful. 'I will open the windows of heaven for you and pour out all the blessings you need'"* The storehouse is the temple or the place where you worship God.

**When** are you supposed to tithe? You do it on the day you worship. The Bible says in 1 Corinthians 16:2, "On every Lord's Day each of you should put aside something from what you have earned during the week, and use it for this offering. The amount depends on how much the Lord has helped you earn". When you give to God on the first day of the week, the first part of your day, and the first part of your money, you're declaring, "You're really number one in my life."

Notice that the verse says to "put aside." You've got to plan this! Tithing should not be an impulsive thing. You've got to plan for it so that you are honoring God's plan and purpose for tithing. Then you can watch how God blesses and uses you and honors his promise in your life. ~Rick Warren



Thank you for being on the cleaning team this year!! Keeping the building clean and orderly and the restrooms well supplied with paper towels and other necessities is a very important ministry. Visitors get a first impression of our church when they experience our facilities. Clean and properly maintained facilities indicate that we care. Your efforts, in this rather mundane task of cleaning the building, are crucial to Countryside's efforts to evangelize our community. Thank you for caring and thank you for your commitment!!

In order to make things easy for everyone, the church is split into three separate areas. Your responsibility is to clean **prior to each Sunday** of the week. It should only take about an hour for your team to clean one of the areas each week.

#### Area A (if your name is listed first for the month) SANCTUARY, INNER AND OUTER FOYERS, OFFICE

**Weekly:** vacuum floors, straighten material in book racks, pick up old bulletins and paper, empty waste-baskets (don't forget baptism changing room area)

**Once during the month:** vacuum the pews, dust the furniture, use vacuum crevice tool at floor to wall edges, steps, etc.

**As needed:** straighten up furniture, replace defective light bulbs (or tell Roger Curry or Jerry Dufur), clean glass in doors, repeat monthly chores.

# Area B (if your name is listed second for the month) CLASSROOMS, HALLWAY, RESTROOMS IN CLASSROOM & NEAR SANCTUARY

**Weekly**: vacuum floors, straighten up furniture, clean toilet stools and sinks, check paper towels, soap, and toilet paper supply, including an extra roll on the back of each stool, clean mirrors, empty waste baskets and diaper pail in nursery, clean drinking fountain **Once during the month**: use vacuum crevice tool at floor to wall edges, wet mop restroom floors, dust furniture

As needed: wash chalk boards, wash table tops, replace defective light bulbs (or tell Roger Curry or Jerry Dufur), repeat monthly chores

Area C (if your name is listed third for the month) KITCHEN, GYM, LOWER FOYER & HALL, LOWER RESTROOMS, LIBRARY

**Weekly:** dry mop hard surface areas, vacuum carpeted areas, clean toilet stools and sinks, check paper towels, soap, and toilet paper supply, including an extra roll on the back of each stool, clean mirrors, empty waste baskets, clean kitchen sinks and counters, clean drinking fountain

**Once during the month**: wet mop kitchen and restroom floors, wipe down stoves, microwaves, refrigerator and freezer

**As needed:** clean glass in doors, repeat monthly chores, wet mop spills from gym floor, replace defective light bulbs (or tell Roger Curry or Jerry Dufur)

Place all waste material in tied plastic bags and then place in plastic bin located inside the air conditioner fence. List any cleaning supplies that are running low on the pad located just inside the janitor room door. Please tell Roger Curry or Jerry Dufur about anything that needs to be repaired.
