Dear Countryside Church family, I just wanted to give you a guick update on the Construction Club. Construction Club is an extension of Kids Club. It was designed to be an opportunity for a parent and child to learn some basic construction skills. We started meeting for the first time on Saturday, March 6th. For those of you that have had an opportunity to walk through the lower lobby at church near the gym, I'm sure that you have noticed the changes. For those of you who have not had the opportunity to be in the building for a while, we have changed the flooring in the lower lobby from carpet to a vinyl laminate wood plank floor. As you walk into the building at the lower lobby, you are facing the east wall of the lobby area. That wall was furred out and now has a pallet wall appearance. This wall was also covered with a laminate vinyl flooring material, but gives a colorful wood grain



appearance. At the center of the wall in large gold letters it reads "Welcome Home".

Though we have around 40 kids signed up for Kids Club at this point, we have only found three youth that are able to attend Construction Club. We have enjoyed the hard-working company of Adam and Val Rutledge with their kids Grant and Morgan. Also, Bo and Jamie Mathis with their daughter Ava. Another great addition has been Jacob Miller. These folks worked for three Saturdays in a row, working more than 5 hours each time. It was a lot of hard work but I think we would all say it was enjoyable (see following page for pictures).

Several of our faithful Kids Club attenders have expressed interest in Construction Club however, their busy schedules do not allow them to participate on most weeknights or weekends. Perhaps this summer we will reconfigure our program and be able to add more youth. For now this small dedicated bunch will tackle our next project which is putting down carpet squares in the youth church classroom. I will also add here that those of us that worked on the lower lobby project believe it would be a nice addition to the church to replace the carpet down the classroom hallway. However, we agreed that that project is beyond the Construction Club's expertise. If you can recommend someone with those skills, I would like to chat with them (515) 971-0861. So far it has just simply been a lot of fun working with great people.

## MISSION HIGHLIGHT: Outreach International

Outreach International was founded in 1977. Since that time many people have been recruited for missionary and tent making ministries in several countries. "The operating philosophy of Outreach International since its beginning in 1977, is based on the fact that all mankind deserves the chance to hear about the saving grace of Jesus Christ and that it is each Christian's responsibility to do all we can to reach the world with the Good News of Salvation found in Jesus Christ'. Therefore Outreach International has acted as 'starters' for those new to worldwide missions and has helped start, by the grace of God, several new missions across the world." (Brochure of Sept. '10).

"In 1998 there were approximately 18 workers, in 9 projects and 9 countries. Currently there are 60 workers, in 37 projects in 18 countries. By God's grace, OI has helped workers start and establish their own ministries as well as recruited workers to serve with other mission ministries. You have been a part of this effort and we thank you for serving alongside us and the OI missionaries around the world."

Praise God for the blessing of a new office! They moved into their new office last summer and are enjoying the extra space and having plumbing which was not available in the old office building. They have lots going on work wise and ask for our prayers that they will be able to do what needs to be done. In the February 15 newsletter they wrote of their upcoming travel plans to Georgia and later in April to Tennessee for the Next Step Missions Event. However in late February we received an email that Dale and Sonja had both been diagnosed with the Covid virus. Our prayers are for a quick and complete recovery. This will undoubtedly impact some of their spring plans.



In the February newsletter several workers were mentioned who needed prayers. One couple is leaving their overseas work because of political issues in the country they are serving in and returning home. Another has been home for a brief visit due to the untimely death of a grandson in an auto accident. With the Covid virus all of these transitions are more complicated.

OI sends out very few letters seeking financial support for Outreach International General Fund because we trust God working through His people to support this, His ministry. We strive to be good stewards of what the Lord entrusts this ministry to use and stretch the funds.

"Thank you for praying for us and with us - you bless our lives and ministry over and over again and we thank God for you! We love you all. We too, pray for the Lord's Blessings on each of you! Because of Jesus and in His Love, Dale and Sonja." (Newsletter Feb. 2021)

One of the missions under the umbrella of OI is Me and My House in Colima Mexico. Countryside Christian Church also financially supports that work as well as funding OI. What is a

FAITH Promise!

The Faith-Promise is different from a tithe. It is not a pledge made to the church; it is a promise made to God. Faith is called for; not faith-to-get, but faith-to-give. You are urged to ask God what you should trust Him for, the amount He will enable you to give during the coming conference year. The basis of the promise is a relationship between you and God. If for any reason you cannot pay your Faith-Promise, the reason should be explained to God. Make your promise, not on the basis of what you HAVE to give, but on the basis of what you believe God will ENABLE you to give.

Last October, we, as a congregation, promised \$39,770 to go toward the expenses of the seven missions we support. This "COVID year" has been a difficult one for our missionaries. Most have had to curtail portions of their ministries due to limited funds. But God has been faithful to our members of Countryside, and our members have been faithful in their Faith Promise giving. Our missionaries are very grateful to Countryside for sharing God's blessings with them. April 25th will be the beginning of the next "Missions Year." We will be collecting our faith promises for the coming year during the worship service that Sunday.

As you remember, April 25<sup>th</sup> is not just the end of the current Faith Promise year, but it is also our "Mission, Not Impossible" Sunday. We will be sharing an update from each of our missionaries during the worship service that Sunday. Please mark your calendar for this very important day in the life of Countryside and our missionaries. We will look forward to the beginning of the next "Missions Year" with an even larger goal as we bring our Faith Promises forward during the worship service. Remember our missionaries can only continue the important work of sharing the good news of Jesus with the prayerful and monetary support of churches like Countryside!







The hidden surprise in these sweet rolls hints at the reason behind Easter's joy.

#### What you need:

- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup chopped pecans
- 10 uncooked frozen rolls, thawed
- 10 large marshmallows
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup melted butter
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup brown sugar
- Adult help

#### What you do:

- 1. Grease a round baking dish. Sprinkle pecans on the bottom.
- 2. Flatten each roll. Place a marshmallow in the center, wrap dough around it and pinch edges together.
- 3. Combine sugar and cinnamon. Dip each roll into melted butter and coat with cinnamon-sugar. Place in pan, seam side down.
- 4. Sprinkle brown sugar and remaining butter over rolls. Cover with plastic wrap and let rise 30 minutes.
- 5. Bake at 350 degrees until golden brown, about 30 minutes. Cool in pan.
- 6. As you bite into a roll, you'll see the marshmallow has melted, leaving an empty center — just like Jesus' empty tomb!
