Dear Church Family,

If you are watching the news at all or paying attention to the culture, you know that unfortunately there are many divisions that run deep. The question that we should all be asking is: What is my response to a divided culture as a follower of Jesus? Let me offer a few suggestions:

- 1. Focus more on being humble than being right. Our culture seems to want to be right more than it wants truth. Ephesians 4:2 says ..."always be humble and gentle." It seems like everyone wants to be an expert today, everyone wants to be right, some act superior and that they know better...it's toxic. What if we decided to be humble instead of right?
- 2. Focus on correcting your own shortcomings, not others. Jesus said to look at the plank in your own eye and not the piece of sawdust in someone else's. It is really about valuing others, not defaming them. Ephesians 4:2 says "...be patient with each other."
- **3. Focus more on common ground than spreading trouble.** Ephesians 4.3 says "...make every effort to keep yourselves united in the Spirit." Perhaps you have heard the expression: *the truth is somewhere in the middle*. In a polarized culture, most arguments are leaning very hard in one direction. Matthew 18:15 says "...if your brother sins against you, go and show him his fault, just between the two of you. If he listens to you, you have won your brother over."

May God bless us all as we try to find unity and make peace with everyone we encounter for Jesus' sake.

On Saturday October 2<sup>nd</sup>, Countryside will partner with the Erie Christian Church in preparing food bags for IDES (International Disaster Emergency Services). The set up and unloading of the truck will occur at 8:00 A.M. At 9:00A.M. we will begin filling the bags and work until finished filling the bags (4-5 hours). During the set-up we will need approximately 10 people who can lift boxes, move tables and take directions for set up and for being a crew leader. Each crew of 10 will need a leader who can give the crew instructions and oversee their line in bag filling. We are hoping to have six crews, three from Erie, and three from CCC. Thirty-five people from CCC will be needed to be crew members and will require extended periods of standing. We plan to be finished by early afternoon - that will be determined by the number of workers. Snacks and water will be provided. A sign up list is in the church lobby. Even if you can only work for a short period of time, sign up as workers will need rest periods.

IDES provides nutritious meals which are sent to countries that have experienced disasters. Each bag contains the equivalent of 6 meals which can be reconstituted with water. Each meal contains vitamins, minerals and rice. In Sept. of 2018 we prepared 4000 bags or 24000 meals. If you have any questions please see Connie Curry.

### MISSION HIGHLIGHT: Pioneer Bible Translators

Norm and Jill Weatherhead work with Pioneer Bible Translators in Papua, New Guinea as Bible translators. They have been involved there for over 20+ years. They are from Calgary, Canada. Jill works a portion of the year as a registered nurse in Calgary and joins Norm when she can to work with the translation team in PNG. Drawn by a vision to see God's Work changing lives in every language, Norm and his wife, Jill have devoted their lives to translation work.

Currently Norm and Jill are in Calgary, Canada due to the Covid virus. With modern technology, Norm is able to continue his translation work with the individuals in Papua, New Guinea. When he will be able to actually return in person is not known.



In our latest communication with Norm (Sept.2021) he describes the process of translation to make it understandable and accurate in the native language for those in PaPua, New Guinea. They are currently working on the book of Luke. Luke has 24 chapters and 1,151 verses. Norm says that a great day for him is to work through 20-25 verses. An example is Luke 1:1-4 which has 42 words in the Greek, 79 in English and uses 89 words in the Akukem translation. For more detail on the translation process check out the Pioneer Bible Translator booklet on the mission shelf.

Dedication of the Akukem national translators who have stuck with this translation project for 16 years, for sustaining Norm through these years of pain and fatigue to keep on working on Bible translation, we are ready for one last advisor/team check on Luke to be done over six weeks via online Zoom sessions in Oct-Nov.





Pray that Norm can finish all his Advisor questions on the text before we start the checking session in late October, that the national translators will remain healthy and be able to come into Madang in late October to do checking with Norm, for our PBT staff over in Madang, PNG as we continue to operate with very limited numbers of missionaries and staff during this pandemic over there, that the translated book of Luke, when released, will speak to the heart of the Akukem people and it would help lead some of them to Christ as Savior.

Norm and Jill state that they are so grateful for our partnership with them in prayer and financial support. For more information refer to the booklet on the mission table in the foyer.




