

We finished our first full month of our new middle school program, Impact. God continues to surprise us. MISSION HIGHLIGHT: Outreach International

Outreach International was founded in 1977. Since that time many people have been recruited for missionary work in several countries. "The operating philosophy of Outreach International since its beginning in 1977, is based on the fact that all mankind deserves the chance to hear about the saving grace of Jesus Christ and that it is each Christian's responsibility to do all we can to reach the world with the Good News of Salvation found in Jesus Christ'. Therefore Outreach International has acted as 'starters' for those new to worldwide missions and has helped start, by the grace of God, several new missions across the world." (Brochure of Sept. '10).

"In 1998 there were approximately 18 workers, in 9 projects and 9 countries. Currently there are 60+ workers, in 37 projects in 18 countries. By God's grace, OI has helped workers start and establish their own ministries as well as recruited workers to serve with other mission ministries. Because of supporters like you that continue to support the Outreach International General fund, we are able to have 100% of the funds each missionary raises go to their projects without worrying about funds being taken out for administrative costs and support services."

Praises include Dale and Sonja"s recovery from Covid except for some taste and smell issues for Dale. Several outreach workers have finally been able to return to the field or come home for their furlough or home assignment. A new worker, Austin, is raising support and preparing for a two year commitment at Colegio Biblico Bible College for Spanish speakers in Eagle Pass and in Mexico. OI was able to spend weeks this summer at camps, retreats, and VBS's with the opportunity to encourage young people. Dale's father Noble Hawkins, celebrated his 90th birthday, a true blessing from God in Dale's life. The new office in Shelbyville continues to bless us and work well as the hub for support services for our 60+ workers in cross-cultural work.



Prayer requests: for our OI worker Ronnie Hoyer who has been diagnosed with Parkinson's, who also has served as the main translator in India, Ezra passed away suddenly from a stroke, he leaves behind a wife, two young daughters and the church family. For the Bledsoe family (Sonja's youth group leader and family) dealing with Covid, for the upcoming Ladies' retreat at Shelby County Christian Assembly, for Sonja and those leading it, for the children and adults who have heard God's message this summer that they will respond, for the fall ICOM in Virginia November 18-21st, for funds for Austin to attend Colegio Biblico, for Sonja and Dale that, with the Lord's help, that they will meet the needs of OI and the workers, being ever sensitive to god leading us through the Holy Spirit, and for our country in all of its issues and our leaders as they make such important and long lasting influential decisions, for all of us (including you our partners in this work) that we will accomplish the purposes God has placed us here to do." FOOD BAG PACKING
I vant to extend a huge thank you to all who helped with the GAP (God Always Provides) food bag acking on October 2nd. There were 75-80 volunteers who worked from 8:00 am -2:00 pm. There were 6,720 bags filled (40,320 meals, 6 meals /bag). Many of these food bags will be sent to Haiti where they are recovering from a recent hurricane.
GAP is one of the programs of IDES (International Disaster Relief Service). Countryside regularly aupports IDES through our Faith/Promise mission program. We partnered with Erie Christian Church financially and with workers for this event. This was the third time for the food bag packing. Our both financially and with workers for this event. This was the third time for the food bag packing in 2023. Prior to that time \$2000 will need to be set aside in our budget to cover the cost of the ingredients needed to fill the bags.


