Welcome to 2022 everyone, and have you made your New Year's resolutions? The most common New Year's resolution in America is to get in shape. I know just a little bit about that, for over the years I have been in and out of shape many times. Perhaps you've heard the joke when people say I'm going to get in shape. ...And round is a shape. Back in high school and in my 20's, I spent quite a bit of time at the gym. I had good friends and we would push each other to lift more and more weight. Whether it would be curling or bench pressing, our goal was always to add more weight. When we would set out to get a new personal best as we lay at the bench getting ready to press, we always felt good when we could say "add another plate". Adding another plate meant you were getting stronger. Sometimes we would jab at each other if it looked like the exercise we were doing was too easy we would say. You need to add another plate. This became the measurement of success.

Recently I've been thinking about this in spiritual terms. What is a measurement of success? Is it possible to "add another plate" spiritually?

I came to this conclusion for me: James 1:2-4 "Consider it pure joy my brothers and sisters whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance, let perseverance finish its work so that you may be mature and complete not lacking anything."

Consider it pure joy when you face trials? In my life, trials bring a heavy heart. If a trial is heavy, does that mean God is adding a plate? Is it possible that God is adding a plate because he knows the truth about what he has told me: *Philippians 4:13 I can do all things through Christ who gives me strength*. Does that mean that not only God did add the plate but he knows I can lift it? Does that mean that God knows better than I do...?

1 John 4:4 The one who is in you is greater than the one who is in the world.

I have been encouraged by these thoughts lately. I, like most people, prefer a smooth flat path for my life. However, hills, valleys, curves, and bumps are usually the path we all get. I have started thinking in my mind that whenever something doesn't go my way, I envision God sliding another plate onto the bar. He knows it won't crush me; he has already strengthened me. He will never leave or forsake me. I will be able to stand up under it. The weight is not too much. It's just going to make me stronger in Him.

To take it even further, if a friend is going through something hard, would it be an encouragement to say to them "God's adding plates"? In the gym it was cool when you could add plates. Is it cool that God puts more weight on because He knows you can stand up under it? God knows your max and you have not yet hit your personal best?

Recently, for me (when I'm at my best) instead of getting mad or scared or frustrated when life gets hard, I find myself smiling and saying to myself... God's adding plates. And really... that's a good thing.

Well here we are. Welcome to 2022. Maybe this will be the year we all get stronger and in better shape with Jesus?

## MISSION HIGHLIGHT: Rock River Christian Camp

Rock River Christian Camp is located near Polo, IL. It is our local Christian Camp and is supported by approximately 34 Christian churches.

"We are thankful to say that we had a wonderful summer camp season in 2021! It came with a few challenges and blessings at the same time. We were able to hold all of the camp sessions that we had planned to have this summer. Seven people were baptized in the camp pool this summer! What a great blessing! We know that others went home and made that decision to follow Christ as well. One life changed, and it is all worth it."

"We want to inform you of some things that are affecting the camp financially in 2021-2022 and moving forward so that you can know how to be in prayer for the camp and understand what the camp's needs are currently. Even though we are debt –free, we depleted most of the reserve we had for projects and savings to stay afloat this summer. Number one: the number of campers was down this summer, 870 people came through, Covid uncertainty affected some and some camps were limited to 50% capacity. Number two: the cost of food went up significantly this year. Some of the cost was due to more individual serving items and disposable items. Number three: hourly wages for summer staff and all staff increased. Much of the summer staff is paid minimum wage and that rate has increased form \$7;25/hr. to the current \$11/hr. and will increase to \$12/hr. on Jan. 1 They currently hire 15-20 summer staff so this is a huge increase, Number 4: insurance has increased partly due to the increase in the cost of building materials.

To keep Rock River Christian Camp going each year is very expensive. We work hard to keep the cost to a minimum, but we also want to provide good camp service, so we ask for your help. Would you please give to Rock River Christian Camp? If you have been blessed and can help offset some of the cost, we would greatly appreciate it. Consider giving a year end gift to the camp." (Newsletter Oct. 2021)

The camp has a wish list for needed items. They include: water fountains, Lifetime chairs, Lifetime tables, a dump truck, cabin mattresses. basketballs, luggage carts, washing machine, clothes dryers. pool chairs, Amazon gift cards, Walmart or Sam's club gift cards, and Staples gift cards.

"We want to thank all of you that have prayed for the camp, have given financially, or volunteered your time at camp this year. We also thank our camp board members, the year round and summer staff, deans, and all the summer faculty. We also thank everyone that came as a camper this year. We greatly appreciate you. This camp would not be here without any of you. God has used each and every one of you to work in the lives of all who come here. Please know you are loved, appreciated and prayed for."




# -Sanctity of human life-

Churches around the United States use the day to celebrate God's gift of life, commemorate the many lives lost to abortion, and commit themselves to protecting human life at every stage.

Deliver those who are being taken away to death, and those who are staggering to slaughter, oh hold them back! If you say, "See, we did not know this," does He not consider it who weighs the hearts? And does He not know it who keeps your soul? And will He not render to man according to his work? Proverbs 24:10-12

"The purpose of tithing is to teach you always to put God first in your lives" (Deuteronomy 14:23).

Whatever you want God to bless, you have to put him first in. So if you want God to bless your finances, you have to put him first in your money. This is the principle of tithing: You give the first 10 percent of your income back to God.

Here are four verses that explain the **promise, the purpose, the place, and the day for tithing**. First, Prov 3:9-10 gives the promise about tithing: "Honor the Lord by giving him the first part of all your income, and he will fill your barns with wheat and barley and overflow your wine vats with the finest wines". God says that if you honor him with the first part of your income, he will bless you financially.

**Why** does God tell us to tithe? Deuteronomy 14:23 says, "The purpose of tithing is to teach you always to put God first in your lives" (TLB). God doesn't need your money, but he wants what it represents: your heart. He wants you to trust him.

Where should you tithe? Do you tithe to United Way? Or do you tithe to your brother who's been out of work for three years? No. That's charity. Tithing is an act of worship. It goes to God. Malachi 3:10 says, "'Bring to the storehouse a full tenth of what you earn . . . Test me in this,' says the Lord All-Powerful. 'I will open the windows of heaven for you and pour out all the blessings you need'" The storehouse is the temple or the place where you worship God.

**When** are you supposed to tithe? You do it on the day you worship. The Bible says in 1 Corinthians 16:2, "On every Lord's Day each of you should put aside something from what you have earned during the week, and use it for this offering. The amount depends on how much the Lord has helped you earn". When you give to God on the first day of the week, the first part of your day, and the first part of your money, you're declaring, "You're really number one in my life."

Notice that the verse says to "put aside." You've got to plan this! Tithing should not be an impulsive thing. You've got to plan for it so that you are honoring God's plan and purpose for tithing. Then you can watch how God blesses and uses you and honors his promise in your life. "Rick Warren

Thank you for being on the cleaning team this year!! Keeping the building clean and orderly and the restrooms well supplied with paper towels and other necessities is a very important ministry. Visitors get a first impression of our church when they experience our facilities. Clean and properly maintained facilities indicate that we care. Your efforts, in this rather mundane task of cleaning the building, are crucial to Countryside's efforts to evangelize our community. Thank you for caring and thank you for your commitment!!

In order to make things easy for everyone, the church is split into three separate areas. Your responsibility is to clean **prior to each Sunday** of the week. It should only take about an hour for your team to clean one of the areas each week.

Area A (if your name is listed first for the month) SANCTUARY, INNER AND OUTER FOYERS, OFFICE **Weekly:** vacuum floors, straighten material in book racks, pick up old bulletins and paper, empty waste-baskets (don't forget baptism changing room area)

**Once during the month:** vacuum the pews, dust the furniture, use vacuum crevice tool at floor to wall edges, steps, etc.

**As needed:** straighten up furniture, replace defective light bulbs (or tell Roger Curry or Jerry Dufur), clean glass in doors, repeat monthly chores.

Area B (if your name is listed second for the month) CLASSROOMS, HALLWAY, RESTROOMS IN CLASSROOM & NEAR SANCTUARY

**Weekly**: vacuum floors, straighten up furniture, clean toilet stools and sinks, check paper towels, soap, and toilet paper supply, including an extra roll on the back of each stool, clean mirrors, empty waste baskets and diaper pail in nursery, clean drinking fountain

**Once during the month**: use vacuum crevice tool at floor to wall edges, wet mop restroom floors, dust furniture

**As needed:** wash chalk boards, wash table tops, replace defective light bulbs (or tell Roger Curry or Jerry Dufur), repeat monthly chores

Area C (if your name is listed third for the month) KITCHEN, GYM, LOWER FOYER & HALL, LOWER RESTROOMS, LIBRARY

**Weekly:** dry mop hard surface areas, vacuum carpeted areas, clean toilet stools and sinks, check paper towels, soap, and toilet paper supply, including an extra roll on the back of each stool, clean mirrors, empty waste baskets, clean kitchen sinks and counters, clean drinking fountain

**Once during the month**: wet mop kitchen and restroom floors, wipe down stoves, microwaves, refrigerator and freezer

**As needed:** clean glass in doors, repeat monthly chores, wet mop spills from gym floor, replace defective light bulbs (or tell Roger Curry or Jerry Dufur)

Place all waste material in tied plastic bags and then place in plastic bin located inside the air conditioner fence. List any cleaning supplies that are running low on the pad located just inside the janitor room door. Please tell Roger Curry or Jerry Dufur about anything that needs to be repaired.
