MISSION HIGHLIGHT: Me & My House

Josh and Susan Sanchez are missionaries who established the church in Manzanillo, Mexico and are now working with the church in Colima, Mexico. They have worked in Mexico since January of 2006. Josh grew up in Mexico City, Mexico and attended Central Christian College in Moberly, MO 1999-2003. Susan grew up in Mexico, MO in the Christian Church. She attended CCCB in 1999-2003 also.

Prayer needs: Safety in the storm of this drug war, Isaac in high school in Texcoco, road to church getting cemented to fix constant wash-outs from storms. Rafa and Scarlett"s family issues, the carpentry ministry, and finishing the house. You can read more about the mission in Colima and the Sanchez family in the mission booklet on the mission table.



This past year the Sanchezes have moved from Manzanillo to Colima to establish a new church. The year has presented many challenges in moving as well as getting established in a new area and starting a new church. They have also taken in teenagers, Rafa and Scalett who previously lived in Manzanillo.

July 7th was a busy day for the Sanchezes. Scarlett graduated from high school in the morning and Sam graduated from 6th grade in the evening. Scarlett will now be attending the same campus as Rafa starting August 15. Scarlett had been attending one of the best high schools in the country 30 minutes away with no bus route and Rafa was attending school in the opposite direction. Scarlet graduated with all A's so it was worth it. She will now be attending the same University as Rafa.

During August they had their first visitors after having moved and been shut out because of Covid. Dave and Sue McConeghey came with many Amazon purchases, including shoes men's size 12W and 14 for the boys and soccer equipment for a local team for under-privileged girls that is coached by a man we have been working to reach for years and gave us one more way to connect. All of this saved lots of dollars in shipping expenses.

Josh has always enjoyed wood working and is using that creativity to connect with people. He helped Manuel make a kitchen storage area for his tiny apartment. Oralia lost parts of her home in a hurricane and Josh continues to make pieces of furniture to replace what was lost.

"Josh took Isaac to live this coming school year, his freshman year, in Josh's hometown of Texcoco. It was a decision based on a number of factors including some major walls he was hitting in his schooling, and some major growth and maturity that needed a bigger space to stretch out his wings that a city plagued with lockdowns due NOT to Covid but a local drug war that is daily taken to the streets. (Colima closed the month of August with 71 homicides, making 594 for the year so far). Other factors including his desire to do basketball in a major city league, and time to spend with his Mexican side of the family to better know them and his roots. He is there and adjusting."

Sam turned 12 this month. Yet another birthday party cancelled. This time not due to Covid, but a recent increase in the violence that not only had Sam's buddies unable to leave their homes out of fear, but also a number of local businesses that closed down temporarily or a few even permanently. A leader of one of the local gangs was caught and in retaliation a number of vehicles were lit on fire throughout the city, gun battles broke out, and citizens were terrorized. So Sam went to Manzanillo for a day with a friend, and then we invited a close friend over from Manzanillo and the kids went to play paintball. It's hard not to give in to the fear sometimes. Sam then celebrated with his favorite, tutor, his favorite cheesecake, and sushi." (*August newsletter*)




