

MISSION HIGHLIGHT: IDES

IDES stands for International Disaster Emergency Service. IDES exists to bring glory to God by meeting physical and spiritual needs in our hurting world until Jesus returns. For the past 45 years IDES has served as a channel through which Christian Churches/Churches of Christ and individual Christians could meet the physical and spiritual needs of suffering people throughout the world. The vision statement: "IDES vision is to lead the independent Christian Churches/Churches of Christ in responding to disasters and emergencies in the United States and throughout the world by mobilizing financial and physical resources to and through their missionaries and congregations for the purpose of benevolent evangelism."



IDES has been the one source our churches and missionaries consistently turn to for help meeting physical and spiritual needs of suffering people throughout the world in the name of Jesus Christ. They have distributed millions of dollars over the years to help with disaster relief, development projects, medical needs, evangelism and hunger. Among independent Christian Churches/Churches of Christ, the work of IDES is unique.

IDES has been working with partners all around the world to bring help and hope to those in need while sharing the love of Christ with them. Here are a few brief highlights from the first half of our year 2022: Working with 68 partners in 43 countries, making more than 100 projects possible all around the world and helping more than 170,00 people in need, 1,502,061 pounds of food provided.

"This year, IDES has been more active than ever with projects from each of our five focus areas in locations near and far. In 2022 we have already been involved in over 100 projects in 43 countries. Some of these projects include: a leadership conference in Zimbabwe through IDES Evangelism and Discipleship focus, Medical Care in South Sudan, Hunger Relief in Kenya, clean water wells in Nigeria as part of our community Development efforts, and major disaster Response from the US to Ukraine.

Kansas, Kentucky, Ohio, Honduras, Poland, Ukraine, India, Kenya, Pakistan, Afghanistan the list of locations where IDES has active projects goes on and on. As long as there is a need, IDES will be there sharing immediate Help and eternal Hope with those both near and far." (Newsletter Summer 2022)






It's already that time again!!


