Cross-Eyed

Doug was in the seventh grade when he first realized he was having problems with his vision. He was having to squint to see what was written on the blackboard—a sure sign he needed glasses. But he really didn't appreciate his need for them until he put them on for the first time.

Before he put on his new prescription glasses, the assistant at the office said, "Look across the street." He did, and then she said, "Now, put your glasses on and look across the street." He did and was amazed at how the parked cars were so much clearer. He couldn't believe how poor his vision had been and how improved the glasses made it.

Communion gives us the opportunity each Lord's Day to refocus our spiritual vision. It's not unlike the salve Jesus told the church at Laodicea they needed to acquire and apply to their eyes (Revelation 3:18). Things can happen in our lives during any given week—personal problems and challenges, situations that loved ones or friends are dealing with, or sometimes just the way the world seems to be going. Our focus wanders from the Lord . . . from his presence with us and his promises to us in Scripture. It can require some serious squinting to see him amid all the distractions.

When Jesus established Communion as a memorial for his followers to observe, he said, "Do this in remembrance of me." A part of that is remembering that Jesus is still with us "to the very end of the age" (Matthew 28:20). We cannot see that far into the future, but according to Paul, any time we partake of Communion, we "proclaim the Lord's death until he comes" (1 Corinthians 11:26). When Christ returns, we will take our place at the "wedding supper of the Lamb" (Revelation 19:9), which will be an even greater "Lord's Supper." For now, the emblems of Communion provide a way to carry out John the Baptist's command: "Look, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!" (John 1:29). It's probably the only time when being *cross*-eyed is a good thing.


Did you turn in your Sonfish Bank yet? We have been able to raise abut \$150 so far to help with our IDES Food-packing event!

MISSION HIGHLIGHT: Pioneer Bible Translators

Norm and Jill Weatherhead work with Pioneer Bible Translators in Papua New Guinea as Bible translators. They have been involved there for over 20+ years. They are from Calgary, Canada. Drawn by a vision to see God's work changing lives in every language, Norm and his wife, Jill have devoted their lives to translation work.



As I write this article Norm is on his way to Papua New Guinea after a three year lapse due to Covid. "On Sunday afternoon (Feb. 12) I (Norm) will be starting my long trip over to Madang, Papua New Guinea. This journey will take 4 days to travel on 5 flights through 4 countries before I will arrive in Madang on Thursday, Feb. 16.

Praise God that after almost 3 years. I will be able to return to PNG to work in-person with my Akukem national translation team. After 3 years of working on the text of Luke, we are ready to do the Final Consultant Check on the Akukem Gospel of Luke. Praise God that Steve Hayward, who will be the outside consultant, received his Entry Visa to allow him to come to PNG to conduct the checking session." (Newsletter Feb. 10)

"Jill has recently made a book launch of her new devotional book "A Devotional Journey" by Jill Weatherhead. We think you will enjoy reading this book which comes out of all the life lessons Jill has learned as a servant for the Lord and as a child of God. This book is one way that Jill can give back out of the fullness of her walk with the Lord, and her/our prayer is that you would be blessed by this book. Jill is already thinking of some ideas for future books to write which will continue her ministry of helping people to rediscover the total beauty that is in each of us, designed by God." Dear Family & Friends,

We wanted to get a quick word out to you all so you could be praying with us and for us. As we write this we are in route to the Appalachian Christian Camp in East Tennessee where our first Next Step Mission Event of the year is being held. As many of you know, this is the mission retreat we host for those interested in exploring the opportunities for cross-cultural missions and their part in it. Please pray for the Lord's direction in the lives of those attending and for them to be sensitive to the Lord's leading. Pray for those of us who will be sharing and leading as well.

As you may already know, Dale's Dad (Noble Lee) was diagnosed with Myelofibrosis and has become very weak. He has been staying with us in our home for the past two weeks as he began a new medication and tries to regain some strength. Kelvin, Dale's brother, came to stay with Noble Lee so that we could leave for this event. This past week Noble Lee has shown some improvement in his strength, which is a big encouragement for us. He received a blood transfusion a week ago, and since then we have seen a little improvement each day. We are so thankful for the improvement he has made. God has been faithful to sustain him (and us). Please continue to pray for Dale's Dad as he deals with this new diagnosis of Myelofibrosis. Pray also that he will continue to do well with the medication and treatment. Pray for us as we continue to care for him while he adjusts to the treatment plan. Pray for Kelvin as he cares for Noble Lee over the next several days (we so appreciate Kelvin being willing to do that). Pray that Noble Lee will be able to return soon to the Shelbina Villa where he and Emmalynn have been living since the end of December. Please pray that the Lord will renew our strength as we strive to keep up with all our responsibilities. We feel the weight of being the primary caregivers for Dale's Dad as well as concerns for Emmalynn during this time. Many of you have lived through that yourselves and understand what that means.

As always, please continue to remember the Outreach International missionaries and national workers as they serve on the field.



"The scale of the disaster here in Turkey is over whelming. The total affected area is larger tha n the entire state of Indiana (more than 42,00 0 square miles) but as we walked the streets of several of the worst hit cities, it is also deeply personal." (IDES International Project Managers currently on the ground in Turkey) In a different region, a partner described the extreme needs of the situation, stating that "Epidemics [are] breaking out because of unburied corpses. Looters [are] confronting aid workers at gun point (workers evacuated from one location before our people arrived there)." But even in the midst of sorrow, chaos, and devastation, our Project Managers say that the gospel is still going forth--"The tiny and persecuted church here is responding with food, hygiene, blankets and other aid as they are able in the worst hit cities. Frequently they are asked by recipients, 'who are you and why are you helping?' which allows for a natural and loving witness about the hope and help of Christ."

Our Latest Prayer & Praise

The plan was relatively simple: Fly to Australia via Vancouver and Auckland, rest for two nights and then fly up to Madang, PNG. I was looking forward to writing everyone to say, "I'm finally in PNG after being away for 3 years." Then everything went sideways.

Checking in at Calgary on Sunday, Feb 13 I was informed that travelers needed an entry visa to New Zealand, even though I was transiting in and out of the airport in just a 5-hour period. No worries, they told me it would take 15 minutes online to get the electronic visa. Well.... Hours later, having missed three possible flights, no visa, and no rebooking possible even though an airline agent worked with me for 90 minutes on the phone to find a new route, I had to trust God that a solution would be found.

So... back to the house... (thanks Jill for rescuing me at midnight), and finally by 4am I found a new route via Los Angeles which only cost us an additional \$1500!! So off to the airport again and on to Australia. Praise God I had thought of booking two overnights in Brisbane. I caught up to the 2nd overnight and then early next morning I was off to PNG.

I arrived in Port Moresby with just enough time to buy a new phone number for my PNG phone (they recycle your number if it's not used after a certain period), and over to Domestic Terminal to fly to Madang. Just minutes before boarding.... "Flight Cancelled!" was announced. PTL I had booked Air Niugini from Brisbane to Moresby to Madang, so the airline put me up at a downtown hotel. I had enough time to get a bite to eat and sleep for 4 hours before returning to the airport again at 3am.

We boarded the plane and took off for Madang. Hooray, I'm finally going to be back in Madang. Oops, wait, why are we circling Madang. I can see the town below!! Four rounds of circling, and then.... back to Port Moresby. There was an intense rain storm below and there was too much water on the runway to land. Anxiously we wait in the Domestic Terminal.... and then word to board the plane and try again.

Yes!!! We landed in Madang!! I experienced 2 cancelled flights, an aborted flight, a complete new booking with extra cost, traveling on 6 planes through 4 countries in 5 ½ days of travel to <u>finally</u> arrive in Madang, PNG.

NEWS BULLETIN: I found out during my trip that Auckland, New Zealand was besieged by the worst cyclone they had ever experienced in over 100 years with severe flooding and damage done to the country. **Pray** for their recovery... and, **praise God** I <u>did not</u> get on a plane to New Zealand and either a) be diverted to a different country I didn't know, or b) be grounded for days in Auckland if we had got there.

NEWS BULLETIN: there is a major dispute right now between the PNG banks and the fuel company resulting in planes being grounded across PNG. <u>Pray</u> for a resolution to this fuel crisis which is affecting all air and ground transportation. <u>Praise God</u> that I was able, not once but twice, to be able to fly from Port Moresby to Madang to finally arrive at my destination.

AKUKEM PROJECT: 3 men of our national translation team have arrived in Madang, and I have worked with them this week to clean up loose questions in Luke. **Pray** that the other 5 Akukem men can arrive on Monday to join us as part of the checking session on Luke. AND... **Pray** that our PBT consultant who will check our translation of Luke will also be able to arrive this weekend. **Steve Hayward** is journeying from Missouri to Madang and he needs our prayers that he will not experience interruptions to his travels.

NEWS CONCERNING JILL: a regular "FIT" test was scheduled by Jill's doctor before she would travel to join me here in PNG. Based on that test, a polyp had been found and the doctor further scheduled Jill for a colonoscopy. They were able to remove the polyp, but it was larger than expected and the procedure was more difficult than expected. She was told that she should not travel for at least two weeks post procedure, and the polyp has been sent on for standard further testing.

Due to the delay in time for this procedure, and the possibility of not having any travel medical insurance for her if anything happened related to this while traveling here to PNG, we have made the tough decision that Jill will stay back in Canada while I work with the Akukem over the next four weeks in Madang. **Pray** for Jill to feel well quickly. And **pray** for both of us as we have made this decision to be apart so that I can concentrate on the Akukem translation session at hand.

Through all of this, we are continually reminded that "We walk by faith, and not by sight." (2 Cor. 5:7) and that we must bathe all our plans in prayer, trusting in Jesus who loves us and gave himself for us. And... our prayer is that the Akukem people will come to know these truths as well. For their sakes, all of these trials of ministry and life are worth it.

Sixteen days without stopping!


