The school year is winding down, and Kids Club has already come to the end of the 2022-2023 school year. We started with a big party last September and had over 150 people on campus with 60 kids signing up for Kids Club. We averaged about 40 kids in attendance through November. December, January, and February averaged around 35. As the weather warmed up this spring, attendances declined and since spring break we ran about 28 kids. This pattern of attendance closely resembles other kids' programs in churches across the country.

Last fall we set out to teach the kids about Jesus and encourage them to memorize five Bible verses. A highlight for me this year is that most of the kids can tell you what Genesis 1:1, Psalm 119:105, John 3:16, Ephesians 4:32, and Proverbs 14:12 say. What makes this most exciting to me? The majority of the kids that attend do not have a church home. Countryside Christian Church Kids Club program is their church home, and they are learning.

As we look to starting Kids Club back up in the fall, will you please pray that God will lead in our planning? We have been blessed to have a Riverdale School bus deliver kids from the school to our church on Wednesday afternoons. Next year, some changes are coming to bus scheduling and this could affect our programming. At this point, this is an unknown variable that will be worked out over the summer. So, please be praying that God will reveal the perfect plan for His kingdom. Pray that God would allow us to continue to shine a light on his Son with the youth in our community.

One last thing: please prayerfully consider how you might be a part of the Kids Club staff in the fall. The workers are few, the harvest is ripe.

MISSION HIGHLIGHT: Rock River Christian Camp

Rock River Christian Camp is located near Polo, IL. It is our local Christian Camp and is supported by approximately 30 Christian churches.

"Camp is an investment in the kingdom and God's people, especially our children. What happens at camp? What comes from our children going to camp? Campers experience a week on their own, experiencing God in their own community in nature, helping them grow in their faith with other kids away from their everyday influences. Sometimes kids can grow up in the church with their family, which is excellent, but many times their parent's faith is what they take on. Camp gives our children time away from their parents to help them grow their own faith and friendships outside their local church in Christ. I think kids that attend camp help grow their church. Camp is a unique experience. Giving our kids as many different experiences in Godly environments helps them figure out who they are as servants of Christ. None of us are the same and we grow in different environments. The more God-centered encounters they experience, the more well-rounded followers they will be." (Newsletter Jan. 23)



One of Countryside's young people, Connor Kohrt, was a camper in 2022 and made the decision to be baptized. He came home and was baptized on July 24th. It is an example of the impact the camp has on young lives.

The camp theme for 2023 Is REVERSE Matthew 5:1-12. Camp registrations for 2023 are currently being taken. Countryside Christian Church will pay up to \$100 of the registration fee. The S.A.W.(Servants at Work) has been reestablished this year. \$167.50 can be earned for each week working at camp. Positions for cook and other summer staff are also being taken. Spring work day at



camp is scheduled for Saturday April 29. Many volunteers are needed to get the camp ready for this season.

There are many financial needs of the camp, including day to day expenses and long term maintenance projects. Roof are needed on the Fireside Hall, the Earth Lodge, the Old Chapel., the well house, the garage and the Office.

TING TO KNOW THE REAL



For years, I held an unrealistic view of the model Christian woman. I grew up believing the ideal godly woman was an over-worked, exhausted wife and mother, whose kids were perfect, home was spotless, and who consistently maintained a selfless, subservient, and sacrificial attitude, — regardless of her circumstances or state-of-mind. Traits that, at the time, I thought were essential for any devoted, Bible-believing, woman of God. Attributes I tried tirelessly — without success I might add to model for years.

After more than 20 years of striving to live up to my aggrandized view of Proverbs 31:10-31, I finally unearthed the truth. The real woman described in this passage, is a God-fearing, dedicated, and independent woman. She bravely dives into leadership roles and takes on challenging positions with courage and confidence. When I finally discovered the true attributes of this bold and driven woman, she won my heart and inspired my future. Granted, it's impossible for any woman to live up to the full description of the Proverbs 31 woman, but I believe, this passage is meant to inspire us to be the unique, persistent, fearless women God created us to be. Therefore, let's push past the boundaries our society sets, and those we set for ourselves, and embrace our God-given potential with God's ever-present help (Psalm 46:1).

Take a look at the attributes described in Proverb 31 and take note of traits you sense God is calling you to appropriate into your life.


The woman of Proverbs 31 embraces her value (v10,28) and is:

- Honest and trustworthy (v11)
- An entrepreneur (vv13,14,16,24)
- Wise and discerning (vv13,18,26,27)
- Hardworking and Resourceful (vv13,19,24,27) Confident and optimistic (v25)
- A loving provider (vv14,15,21,24)
- Generous and kind (vv15,20,26)
- A supervisor (vv15,27)

- Independent and successful (vv16,24)
- Courageous and strong (vv17,21,25)
- Well-spoken of (v23)
- Praised by others (v28,31)
- Dedicated and godly (vv18,30)

Today, this passage inspires me to use the gifts, talents, and abilities God has given me to their full potential. Today, I continually sense God urging me to break out of my comfort zone in order to pursue His calling. And — today, I spend less time worrying about who and what I'm not — and more time striving to be all I can be. Allow Proverbs 31 to inspire us to be the fearless, dedicated, faithful women of God He is calling us to be.
