Rock River Christian Camp is located near Polo, IL. It is our local Christian Camp and is supported by approximately 30 Christian churches.


"Camp is an investment in the kingdom and God's people, especially our children. What happens at camp? What comes from our children going to camp: Campers experience a week on their own, experiencing God in their own community in nature, helping them grow in their faith with other kids away from their everyday influences. Sometimes kids can grow up in the church with their family, which is excellent, but many times their parent's faith is what they take on. Camp gives our children time away from their parents to help them grow their own faith and friendships outside their local church in Christ. I think kids that attend camp help grow their church. Camp is a unique experience. Giving our kids as many different experiences in Godly environments helps them figure out who they are as servants of Christ. None of us are the same and we grow in different environments. The more Godcentered encounters they experience, the more well-rounded followers they will be."

The camping season for 2023 saw 10 campers attend from Countryside. CCC will contribute financially toward camp registration for each camper attending a week of camp. Registration will begin in a month with early discounts being available. Faculty and camp leaders are needed for many camps including medical staff for some of the camps. The SAW program was brought back last summer where a week of work at camp can be exchanged for financial help with camp registration fees.

There are many financial needs of the camp, including day to day expenses and long term maintenance projects. Roofs are needed on the Earth Lodge, the Old Chapel., the well house, the garage and the Office. An extensive rework of the Earth Lodge is planed so the financial need at this time is great.

Wing Wong has worked for over 54 years in China presenting the message of Christ to the people and also to the Chinese people worshipping in New Hampshire.

MISSION TRIP 2024 "We do have a big plan for this summer, but we need your prayers and help. Starting from mid-June to early August our US team of seven is going to have a retreat and workshop with our China core leaders and host two youth camps. We are also planning to do a number of outreach events with the local churches. We also want to praise the Lord with you that we have just added two more HES classes!" (newsletter Feb. 24)

"Praise God for our brothers and sister in China who keep God's words and have not denied His name! Please pray that they will continue to be faithful in our Lord and make more disciples for Him." (Oct. 2022 newsletter)

Many young people are being brainwashed into the communist philosophy of atheism and rejecting Christianity. Spreading the Gospel message is becoming more and more of a challenge. Several small church groups are meeting in homes for their safety. A music center has opened and several students have signed up for lessons. Please pray that this center will make a good impact to the community and attract more people to Christ and pray for their safety as well. Another Bible study in a second-tier city has started. Pray that more disciples can be made and another new church will be planted. Most importantly please pray for all the Christians in China for their safety from Communist rule.

Josh and Susan Sanchez are missionaries who established the church in Manzanillo, Mexico and are now working with the church in Colima, Mexico. They have worked in Mexico since January of 2006. Josh grew up in Mexico City, Mexico and attended Central Christian College in Moberly, MO 1999-2003. Susan grew up in Mexico, MO in the Christian Church. She attended CCCB in 1999-2003 also.

This past year the Sanchezes have moved from Manzanillo to Colima toe stablish a new church. The year has presented many challenges in moving as well as getting established in a new area and starting a new church. They have also taken in teenagers, Rafa and Scalett who previously lived in Manzanillo. Josh returned home November 11th after eight weeks in the United States. "We are so glad to be together as a family." Josh visited Countryside on Oct. 15th.

"The purpose of this trip was (1) a rest break in routine since Josh hasn't taken a break from ministry or been stateside in 5 years, (2) gaining new monthly supporters to replace those we have lost in death or financial hardships, and help the hurt of the failing peso exchange rate (3) update current monthly supporters by physically visiting as many as possible (4) aggressively pay down car debt (5) raise funds to build a room for a single Mom's small business, (6) reconnect with good friends and family (7) purchase clothes and shoes for our children whose sizes cannot be found in MX (example, Isaac wears men's 14 shoes, and the biggest here is 12, 36x34 jeans and the tallest here is 32.")

Financially: one supporting church has committed a generous raise for 2024, a possible raise from another, a positive maybe for a new church supporting us, and 3 couples committing to support us monthly." (newsletter Oct. 23)

Prayer needs: Safety in the storm of this drug war, Isaac's schooling, praise for funds raised, Rafa and Scarlett's family issues, new contacts, families in the church, and Erika's house arrangement. #### LINCOLN CHRISTIAN UNIVERSITY

### What is the future of Lincoln Christian University?

At the end of the academic year, May 31, 2024, Lincoln Christian University will cease academic operations. That is, we will no longer be offering academic credit or degrees. However, please note that:

- On June 1, 2024, in order to celebrate and continue the legacy of our institution, Ozark Christian College will rename their graduate studies department as Lincoln Seminary.
- After May 31, 2024, it is likely the legal entity that is LCU will continue in some capacity for some time as, at a minimum, we will still need to resolve outstanding debts, assets, or other matters.
- There are continued conversations about additional and meaningful ways to continue the legacy of Lincoln Christian University within the local church and the wider world of Christian education, and any updates concerning LCU's ongoing ministry will be shared in a timely manner.

Lincoln Christian University is pleased to announce that an agreement has been reached to sell the remaining portions of the campus to Open Arms Christian Fellowship for \$800,000. This includes Restoration Hall, the Administration Building, the Warehouse, Harmony Hall, Henderson Hall, and 16 acres of greenspace along Route 10 between Chapel View Drive and the former student apartments.

President Silas McCormick says about the sale, "Open Arms has been a wonderful partner and neighbor—particularly these last four challenging years. And since our sale of the eastern and southern portions of the campus to them two years ago, they have grown. Though I grieve what is lost, that grief is certainly not without hope, and I look forward to what may yet be." All proceeds from the sale go toward paying down the university's debt.



### PIONEER BIBLE TRANSLATORS

Norm and Jill Weatherhead work with Pioneer Bible Translators in Papua New Guinea as Bible translators. They have been involved there for over 20+ years. They are from Calgary, Canada. Drawn by a vision to see God's work changing lives in every language, Norm and his wife, Jill have devoted their lives to translation work.

Late this summer Norm and Jill moved into Dallas and became "Dorm Parents" for the 30+ students who are living in the guesthouse and are attending the linguistic school on campus, Dallas International University (DIU). "We are so encouraged by seeing the enthusiasm and desire of these young people to learn the fundamental studies of Applied Linguistics, Sociolinguistics, Ethno-Arts and Musicology, Cross-Cultural Studies, and much more. Many of these students are desiring to go to other countries of the world to impact the people there with the Gospel". (Newsletter Sept. 23)

"The full Akukem national team (5 men and 1 woman) was able to come out from their remote villages to the town of Madang where our PBT office is located in PNG. Our translation team is now starting to work within the epistles of the New Testament. Our focus right now is the Pastoral Epistles(1&2 Timothy and Titus). In just 3 ½ weeks, we were able to go completely through 1 & timothy. Our checking session was just ½ a day each day since my 5pm-10pm was their 8am to 1pm over in Madang."

Travel update: Jill just left Dallas (Oct. 12) to go back to Calgary so she can participate in the New West Orchestra and Singers for one more season and also to host a women's retreat in Pine Lake, AB. Jill is broadening her ministry to touch the lives of women. I (Norm) will return to Calgary for two weeks (Oct.27-Nov.14) as I have travel medical insurance that allows me to travel for 75 days at a time. Jill will return to be with me and the students in the Guesthouse later in December through January." (Newsletter Oct. 23)

#### Praises

- That the Akukem team members were able to travel into and out of Madang as planned to do the online Zoom checking session
- We were able to completely review and revise 1&2 Timothy
- Two new solar panel and laptop systems were purchased to replace old equipment so translation can keep moving forward while they are in their villages.
- No one was hurt physically during the two major earthquakes that hit the Madang area just before they left to go back to the villages.

#### Prayer requests:

- That the translated portions of Scripture will impact the hearts of the translation team members as they work on their translation assignments.
- That we will be able to lay the foundation for printed and audio forms of Scripture which we will be able to get out to people and churches in the next year and beyond.
- That I will learn much from the Paratext courses to help our team improve our methods of Scripture translation and distribution.



#### OUTREACH INTERNATIONAL



Outreach International was founded in 1977. Since that time many people have been recruited for missionary work in several countries. "The operating philosophy of Outreach International since its beginning in 1977, is based on the fact that all mankind deserves the chance to hear about the saving grace of Jesus Christ and that it is each Christian's responsibility to do all we can to reach the world with the Good News of Salvation found in Jesus Christ" Therefore Outreach International has acted as 'starters' for those new to worldwide missions and has helped start, by the grace of God, several new missions across the world." (Brochure of Sept. '10).

"In 1998 there were approximately 18 workers, in 9 projects and 9 countries. Currently there are 60+ workers, in 37 projects in 18 countries. By God's grace, OI has helped workers start and establish their own ministries as well as recruited workers to serve with other mission ministries. Because of supporters like you that continue to support the Outreach International General fund, we are able to have 100% of the funds each missionary raises go to their projects without worrying about funds being taken out for administrative costs and support services."

Dale and Sonja Hawkins are enjoying their new office space with the inside plumbing and additional space. The new office in Shelbyville, Missouri continues to bless them and works well as the hub for support services for our 60+ workers in cross-cultural work. Sonja's mom Annette Hamilton passed away peacefully on June 14th. She had been in declining health for several years. For 6½ weeks she had been under the full time care of her family at Dale and Sonja's home. Al and Annette Hamilton, Sonja's parents, were instrumental in establishing Outreach International in1977. Their faith and commitment to Christ has helped to take the message age of salvation thru Christ to many countries around the world.

A year ago Dale and Sonja began being full time care givers for Dale's parents who are now living full time with them. They are doing a lot of caregiving while doing their best to keep up with everything else. Please keep them in your prayers.

"Thank you for praying for us and with us-you bless our lives and ministry over and over again and we thank God for you! We love you all. We too, pray for the Lord's Blessings on each of you! Because of Jesus and in His Love, Dale and Sonja." (Newsletter Feb. 2021)
