Because I made you for such a time as this.




EDUCATION HIGHLIGHT

Sydney Collis will be graduating on May 19th from Erie High School. She will be studying psychology, starting with Blackhawk College, and plans to become a psychiatrist.


*On June 2nd, we will honor these four graduates during the worship service and with a cake reception following the service.



Looking ahead...on Saturday, May 25th, we will be having a "Caring and Sharing" day!

Time to do some spring cleaning?? You know one person's trash is another person's treasure! Bring your items to the church on May 25th to fill tables in the yard (bring a table if you can) between 9-10am. Everyone in the community is welcome to come and "shop" between 10am-2pm. Any leftover items can be donated to an area donation center. If you have large objects such as furniture or other items, there will be a bulletin board where pictures can be posted and arrangements made for pick up.

Examples of items: towels and bedding, tables and chairs, furniture, tools, clothes bundles (by size or boy/girl).

If you have items you can't haul or you are unable to attend, you can post your items on the bulletin board by the mailboxes in the church hallway.

MISSION HIGHLIGHT: Outreach International

MISSION HIGHLIGHT



Outreach International was founded in 1977. Since that time many people have been recruited for missionary work in several countries. "The operating philosophy of Outreach International since its beginning in 1977, is based on the fact that all mankind deserves the chance to hear about the saving grace of Jesus Christ and that it is each Christian's responsibility to do all we can to reach the world with the Good News of Salvation found in Jesus Christ" Therefore Outreach International has acted as 'starters' for those new to worldwide missions and has helped start, by the grace of God, several new missions across the world." (Brochure of Sept. '10).

"In 1998 there were approximately 18 workers, in 9 projects and 9 countries. Currently there are 60+ workers, in 37 projects in 18 countries. By God's grace, OI has helped workers start and establish their own ministries as well as recruited workers to serve with other mission ministries. Because of supporters like you that continue to support the Outreach International General fund, we are able to have 100% of the funds each missionary raises go to their projects without worrying about funds being taken out for administrative costs and support services."

Dale and Sonja Hawkins are enjoying their new office space with the inside plumbing and additional space. The new office in Shelbyville continues to bless them and works well as the hub for support services for our 60+ workers in cross-cultural work.

Al and Annette Hamilton, Sonja's parents, were instrumental in establishing Outreach International in 1977. Sonja and Dale's faith and commitment to Christ has helped to continue to take the message of salvation thru Christ to many countries around the world.

In May they were able to make a trip to India and work first hand with Cornerstone Bible College a recently established college. In September Sonja's sister, who works as a YES worker in SE Asia, was back for a visit. While here a third sister Fran was able to come from Georgia and the three sisters were able to have a short reunion. Dale and Sonja have been care givers for their parents for the past couple of years. "This year specifically has been among the most challenging for us in many ways having dealt with parent' illnesses and ministry challenges. Several of the Outreach International missionaries, advisers, office personnel and projects have faced a lot of spiritual warfare this year."

Prayer requests: Pray for new workers, pray for Dale's dad health, pray for the missionaries, office staff and directors, pray for Cornerstone Bible College as they make big decisions about building a residential college, also pray for more workers for the fields that are "white unto harvest".

One of the missions under the umbrella of OI is Me and My House in Colima, Mexico. Countryside Christian Church also financially supports that work as well as funding OI.
