"The elders who direct the affairs of the church well are worthy of double honor, especially those whose work is preaching and teaching" (1 Timothy 5:17).


Pastor Appreciation Sunday is Oct. 27th

MISSION HIGHLIGHT: Rock River Christian Camp

Rock River Christian Camp is located near Polo, IL. It is our local Christian Camp and is supported by approximately 30 Christian churches.


"It was a fun and life-changing summer, as we saw 11 campers make the decision to follow Christ and be baptized in the camp pool. The campers got to worship together, share together, have campfires, swim, do the high ropes course, play carpet ball and so much more. They grew together as brothers and sisters in Christ, and we are thankful for each and every one of them." (Newsletter Sept. 24)



The camping season for 2024 saw 10 campers attend from Countryside. CCC will contribute \$125 toward camp registration for each camper attending a week of camp. There are many financial needs of the camp, including day to day expenses and long term maintenance projects. Roofs are needed on the Earth Lodge, the Old Chapel., the well house, the garage and the Office. Extensive electrical is being done at the main camp removing old aerial lines and putting service underground. The Earth Lodge roof fundraiser is about \$6000 short of the goal of \$84000. Final architect and zoning approval should be coming soon and construction will start this fall.



On July 15 the camp lost its 1998 Massey Ferguson 253 (57 hp) 4/WD manual transmission w/front loader bucket tractor which caught fire. A new comparable tractor will cost \$40,000. The camp is currently researching for a gently used replacement.





There is lots of fall cleanup that needs doing, leaves, splitting wood, and many other projects.

Breakfast is served at 8:00, work begins at 8:30 a lunch at noon and work as late as 4:00. Every weekend through mid-November is booked for retreats. So a busy fall is coming.
